End of Week Announcements.

- The **thirteenth week** of the semester has come to an end. The academic week for GEOG 101-02 runs from Friday through Thursday.
- **Lecture Progress.** Economic Geography Lecture 22 has been posted. Look over Chapters 9 and 12. The last lecture topic, *Urban Geography*, will be posted next week.
- **Atlas Extra Credit III.** The atlas extra credit for the final exam focuses on *Political Geography*, **Chapter 11** of the textbook. **The answer sheet is due by 11 PM Thurs., May 13th.** Late submissions will not be graded. Be sure to use the MSWord version of the answer sheet which can be filled in, saved and attached to an email sent to be before the deadline.
- **Required assignments for Part III are due by 10 PM Thursday, May 13, 2021.** For Part III, you need to submit either 2, 3 or 4 essays from the list of options, depending how many you have already been submitted. You need to submit a total of 10 essays based on the formula listed in the syllabus. Each assignment must be freestanding with its own bibliography (don't combine bibliographic entries on one page). The bibliography may be placed immediately after each discussion -- *no need to start it on a separate page.* Required assignments for Part III may be turned in at any time up to the next deadline. Don't wait to the last day to write them. **Remember:** Early submission of Part III essays allows you to revise and resubmit it if there is a major problem with any essay. **Rushed writing = poor writing = lower grades. The chief causes of point reductions for Parts I and II were:**
 - not addressing the question (being off-topic)
 - leaving out a portion of the question (especially for multi-part questions)
 - answers that were too short (less than one page) or too general (not discussing the topic)
 - not following Presentation Guidelines (including not having opening and closing paragraphs, bibliography not in proper format, not indicating which question you are answering.)
- **Think Geographically (TG) Extra Credit Essays.** These optional essays for extra credit are based on the "Think Geographically" section at the end of each chapter. Select one discussion point from any five chapters (maximum of 5 TG may be submitted). See the posted instructions for details. Extra credit may not be turned in late and there is no option to revise/resubmit.
- **Other Extra Credit:** Any required essay topic that is in addition to 10 required essays (i.e., the 11th essay) will earn the same extra credit as a TG essay. The deadline for submission of a proposal for a special extra credit project submission has long passed. **Any project submitted without my prior approval will not be graded.**
