TIME - DISTANCE

In economic geography, time-distance variables are important in the analysis of spatial interaction.

- **1.** Spatial interaction as a percent of time spent traveling between places.
- 2. Spatial interaction by hierarchy of need.
- **3.** Spatial interaction as a cost factor.
- 4. Spatial interaction as an orientation factor.
- 5. Spatial interaction as margins of profitability.

6. Spatial interaction in patterns of land use, land value and transportation routes, including alternates and redundancies.

7. Spatial interaction as put of a *Just-in-Time* delivery system.
